

#### If you've driven or walked past Glen Eden Primary School recently you'll have noticed the breathtakingly beautiful fale in the grounds.

Taking more than two years to plan and build, the fale is a collaboration between local Māori and Pacific communities. The end result is an impressive work of art that the students are excited to show off.

Sāmoan designer Lama Tone designed and built the fale; Cook Islands kai whakairo (master carver) David Maruariki carved the pou; and Tongan artist Filipe Tohi used the traditional art of lalava to create the decorative lashings/bindings. Each lashing is unique and tells a story such as of the fishing nets or the stars.

The students and teachers at the school are loving the new space which can accommodate a whole class. It is also well used at lunchtimes for play and quiet time.

"It's a place for everybody to come together. It's a place for all peoples,

it's a place for us to take children to teach them so many things. It's about voyaging, it's about the narratives of the Pacific, it's a place of learning," says principal Donna Soljan.

"The fale is a storyteller, a custodian between the community and the school. It's an ancestor from Te Moananui a Kiwa, the Pacific Ocean."

The fale is also a gathering space for visitors. Locals are more than welcome to use the space for picnics and gatherings in the weekend.

## JP Services at the CAB

There is a JP at the Glen Eden Citizens Advice Bureau every weekday morning from 10am-12pm. No appointments are necessary – first come, first served. Please be patient if you need to wait.

#### What a JP can do:

- Witness signatures on documents
- Certify copies of documents (including email attachments and phone messages)
- Take oaths, declarations, affidavits, or affirmations
- · Confirm identity

It is important that you do not sign any of your document(s) before you visit a JP. You should complete all other details required. However, if the document needs to be witnessed, declared, or sworn the Justice of the Peace must complete what is required and must personally see you sign it.

If you require certified copies of a document e.g., your driver's licence or passport, you must produce the original and a photocopy of the document to be certified. The CAB volunteers can make copies for you if needed at a cost of 20c per page.

### **Smoking and Eye Problems**

Smoking is one of those lifestyle habits that is entirely harmful to our health. There are no grey areas, no hypotheses, and no conflicting theories about the effect of smoking on human body in general. All of the scientific evidence available proves that smoking is disastrous for health. While smoking has a direct and very evident impact on the respiratory and cardiovascular systems, it doesn't spare other body functions including the ones eyes.

Macula (part of retina responsible for seeing visuals with sharp contrast) malfunctions in a condition called age-related macular degeneration (AMD). Smoking blocks the flow of blood to retina, and thereby promotes AMD. Several studies have suggested that smokers have three times higher incidence of AMD compared to nonsmokers. The risk of AMD due to smoking is further enhanced during old age (up to five times higher compared to non-smokers).

Cataracts (progressive increase in the opacity of the lenses) cause blurred vision, and eventually necessitate a surgery to



replace the lens with an artificial one. While cataract is almost inevitable during old age in majority of the countries throughout the world, its chances and rate of progression increase drastically due to smoking. Smokers are at a double risk of developing cataracts compared to non-smokers.

Smoking as such has adverse impact on diabetes. It increases the risk of diabetes, and diabetes-related complications including diabetic retinopathy. The causal relationship between smoking and aggravation of diabetic retinopathy has been shown across several studies. Smoking can almost double the risk of diabetic complications.

In addition Smoking also has a wellestablished link with blood pressure, and hence a high predisposition to glaucoma. It can damage the blood vessels in retina and create oxidative stress in retinal membrane. Additionally, smoking is also linked to a high risk of developing thyroid eye disease.

I hope this helps as an incentive to stop.

## Little penguins boxed in love out west

Little penguins/Kororā in Piha are being given every chance of thriving on the iconic west coast beach thanks to the combined conservation efforts of the Piha community and Auckland Council.

Twenty roost/nest boxes have been installed along North Piha beach area in the hope that this taonga (treasure) may find a place to safely roost and potentially breed in.

The boxes, paid through the Natural Environment Targeted Rate, were painted by the Piha Community Pre-school before being installed, and Council's Regional Parks team assisted in transporting the boxes along the beach to their designated sites.

While the national population of little penguins is declining, they appear to be gradually recovering along some areas of Auckland's west coast. This encouraging trend was noticed by the Piha NZ Dotterel Minders and Council environmental contractors, who have observed more penguin signs including footprints, while conducting pest control and other conservation related activities there for NZ Dotterels.

Waitākere Ward Councillor Shane Henderson says, "I'm pleased to see more penguin activity in our neighbourhood and this is a reminder that we need to better protect them from predators.

"We're proud to support this community-driven project with more and more people coming on board."

Little penguin, the world's smallest penguin species, measures just over 25cm in height and weighs about 1kg.

This project was a collaboration between Auckland Council, Forest and Bird, Piha NZ Dotterel Minders and Piha Community Preschool.
